Cobh Tour

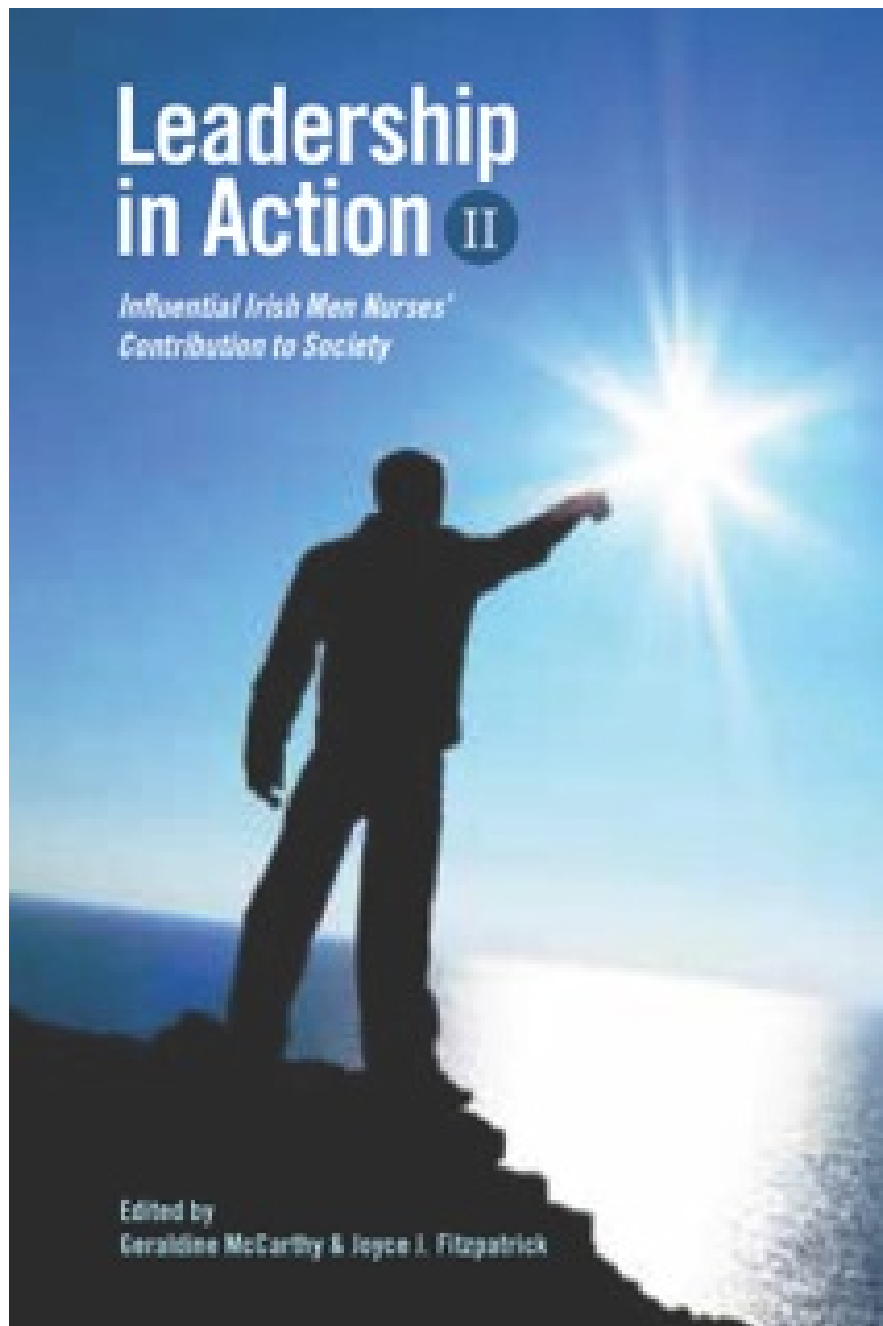

INTRODUCTIONS – WELCOME TO CORK

- a) **Title:** Welcome from the Catherine McAuley School of Nursing & Midwifery, and from University College Cork

Presenter(s): Eileen Savage, *PhD, RGN, RM, RNT, BNS, MEd, Acting Head of School*

Speaker Bio: Eileen Savage was awarded a Bachelor Degree in Nursing Studies (BNS) at University College Dublin (1993), a Masters Degree in Education at University College Cork (1996), and a PhD Degree at the University of Manchester, UK (2004). Prior to pursuing an academic career, she practiced clinical nursing in Ireland and in the UK, specialising in children's nursing. She was appointed as Associate Professor at the School of Nursing and Midwifery, University College Cork in 2008 and is currently Acting Head of School. Eileen is actively involved in teaching and research with a special interest in children's nursing and health care, and chronic illness management. In 2009, she spent a period of 6 months at Yale School of Nursing, New Haven CT, working with Professor Margaret Grey on research into childhood diabetes. She currently supervises MSc and PhD research students.

- b) **Title:** History of Cork and Ireland

Presenter(s): Mary Haslam *PhD, BA, MA, Lecturer, New York University, USA.*

Speaker Bio: Mary speaks a number of languages and has lectured in French in Ireland, France, Canada, and the USA. She completed a PhD which focused on a comparison between Irish and French-Canadian culture and history. Her research interests include language pedagogy, socio-linguistics, and the politics of language. She is currently a lecturer in French at New York University but spends considerable time each year in Ireland.

LEADERSHIP IN ACTION: INFLUENTIAL IRISH MEN NURSES CONTRIBUTION TO SOCIETY

(BOOK LAUNCH – Edited by Geraldine McCarthy and Joyce J. Fitzpatrick)

Invited Speaker: Maura Pidgeon *PhD (QUB), RGN, RM, BSc, MBA, Chief Executive Officer of the Irish Nursing and Midwifery Board (An Bord Altranais)*

Speaker Bio: Maura Pidgeon started her nursing career in Dublin where she completed her General Nursing Training at the Mater Misericordiae University Hospital Dublin (formerly the Mater Misericordiae Hospital) and Midwifery training at the Coombe Hospital. She went on to hold various staff nurse positions in the major hospitals in Dublin and her career as a nurse midwife brought her to Bangladesh where she worked as a volunteer nurse midwife for Concern Worldwide. On return from Bangladesh her career continued to progress by completing a post registration course in Neonatal Intensive Care Nursing at the National Maternity Hospital Dublin. It was at this stage that she embarked on her BSc (Hons) Nursing, part-time, at the 'New University of Ulster' at Jordanstown, whilst continuing to work in the National Maternity Hospital. Over the course of 30 years, Maura has shown her strength of commitment and leadership in her constant drive for improving patient care through a career path which incorporated extensive leadership and management experience. Maura has held the positions of Director of Nursing (Mater Private Hospital) and Head of Department of Nursing & Health Sciences (Letterkenny Institute of Technology). Maura has a firm belief in the power of knowledge and education and this assisted her attain her MBA from the University of Ulster whilst continuing with her nursing career. She went on to complete her PhD in Leadership from the Queen's University of Belfast in 2009.

Speaker Bio: Shirley Smoyak, a Psychiatric Nurse, Health Care Sociologist and Professor of Public Health, is a member of the Rutgers University College of Nursing, Division of Continuing Studies; a senior researcher in the Rutgers Institute for Health, Health Care Policy and Aging Research; and adjunct faculty at the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey, School of Public Health. Dr Smoyak is a baccalaureate graduate of the Rutgers University College of Nursing (1957). Her doctorate, earned in 1970, is in Sociology, with sub-specialties in families, mental illness and deviance. Her current research projects are: “High Energy Drinks, with and without Alcohol”, “Stalking: Criminal and Clinical Perspectives”, and a “History of Greystone Park Psychiatric Hospital”. She has produced award-winning historical documentaries, recorded as DVDs. Shirley’s international work as a guest lecturer, conductor of workshops and presentations at conferences and conventions was significantly influenced by Dr. Hildegard E. Peplau, and is highly regarded because of its cultural relevance and sensitivity. Awards and honors bestowed upon Shirley include, the New Jersey State Nurses’ Association (NJSNA) Excellence in Practice honor (1990); the Presidential Award for Distinguished Public Service at Rutgers (1991); the NJSNA Roll of Honor (1995); The American Nurses Association (ANA) Living Legend Award (2004); and an Honorary Science Doctorate from Kingston University, London (2009). Furthermore, the Maltese Nurses’ Association celebrated her distinguished professorship, and worldwide influence in psychiatric nursing in 2008. Dr Smoyak has served on the NJSNA Board many times and served as a delegate to the American Nurses Association (ANA). She is a Charter Member of the New Jersey Society of Certified Clinical Specialists in Psychiatric and Mental Health Nursing (1972) and a Charter Fellow of the American Academy of Nursing (AAN). Dr Smoyak is Editor of the Journal of Psychosocial Nursing and Mental Health Services (JPN), having been appointed in 1981.

Title: Survey Report – Inappropriate Authorship in Nursing Publications

Presenter(s): Shawn Kennedy MA, RN, Jane Barnsteiner PhD, RN, FAAN, and John Daly RN, PhD, FAAN

Speaker Bio: Maureen “Shawn” Kennedy is Editor-in-Chief of the American Journal of Nursing. Prior to this, she was the editorial and news director, and director of special programs for the journal. Prior to this, she held positions in private sector, adjunct academic appointments and clinical positions in oncology and emergency nursing. She is coauthor (with Thelma Schorr) of 100 Years of American Nursing.

Jane Barnsteiner is Professor of Pediatric Nursing at the University of Pennsylvania; she also served as Director of Nursing for Translational Research at the University of Pennsylvania Health System and served as Director of Nursing Practice and Research at The Children’s Hospital of Philadelphia. An active researcher and author and co-editor of Quality and Safety in Nursing: A Competency Based Approach to Improving Outcomes, she is also Editor, Research and QI for the American Journal of Nursing.

John Daly is Dean of the Faculty of Health at the University of Technology, Sydney in Australia. He is Editor-In-Chief of Collegian, the refereed journal of the Australian College of Nursing and an active researcher. Additionally, he has extensive policy development and leadership experience gained nationally and internationally.

Session Description: Inappropriate authorship (honorary authors and ghost authorship) has been established as a significant problem in biomedical publications. As more nurses participate in research and quality improvement projects and seek to disseminate their work, these issues are emerging as a significant problem for nursing journals and thus for the profession as well. Presenters will report the results of an international survey of nursing journal editors and authors to assess the prevalence of unethical practices.

GENERAL SESSION 5

Title: Bibliometrics – What Every Editor Should Know

Presenter(s): Matthew Richardson

Speaker Bio: Matthew Richardson is Publishing Information Executive in Elsevier’s Research and Academic Relations department. He studies scientific research through the lenses of publication and citation trends, with a focus on the information flows that construct and change research disciplines. His particular focus is on visualizing networks of scientific publications and fields, to enable a deeper understanding of how journals and disciplines relate to one another. Matthew completed a Master’s Degree in Writing from the University of Warwick, before joining Elsevier in 2010.

Session Description: Bibliometrics is an approach commonly used for the analysis of scientific literature, using the bibliographic data included in documents. Among the methods of bibliometrics is citation analysis, the basis of the most established journal-level citation indicators such as the Impact Factor. Matthew will discuss the origins of bibliometrics, important considerations in the use of citation indicators, and the emergence of alternative metrics.

Speaker Bio: Geri Pearson is currently an Associate Professor at the University of Connecticut School of Medicine. Within this role she is the director of a short term medication management program for juvenile justice youth, The HomeCare Program. She is a member of the American Academy of Nursing and is involved with the special interest group in Psychiatric-Mental Health Nursing. Her research and writing interests are focused on psychiatric management of



pediatric underserved patients with enduring psychiatric illness. She co-edited a textbook in 2012 with Edilma Yearwood, and Jamsetta Newland, *Child and Adolescent Behavioral Health: A Resource for Advanced Practice Psychiatric and Primary Care Practitioners in Nursing*. Boston: Wiley-Blackwell Publishing.

(a) Title: Showcasing Speciality Organisation Journals

Presenter(s): JoAnn Grif Alspach, RN, MSN, EdD, Cindy Munro, RN, ARNP, ANP-BC, PhD, FAAN, and Mary Fran Tracy PhD, RN, CCNS, FAAN

Speaker Bio(s): Dr Alspach has served as editor of *Critical Care Nurse* since 1985. She has consulted and lectured nationally and internationally in critical care nursing, nursing staff development, preceptor preparation and staff competency assessment for 35 years, authored/co-authored 18 books, edited 12 books, and published more than 170 nursing journal articles. Grif has held positions as staff and charge nurse in the U.S. Navy Nurse Corps, Clinical Nurse Specialist in Trauma-Critical Care at Suburban Hospital and the National Institutes of Health in Bethesda, Maryland and currently serves as Associate Faculty for the University of Maryland, Graduate School of Nursing in Baltimore.

Dr Munro is the Associate Dean for Research and Innovation in the College of Nursing at the University of South Florida in Tampa, Florida. Dr. Munro’s research on oral care in critically ill adults has been funded for over 10 years by the National Institute of Nursing Research. She has published more than 100 articles. Dr Munro is a Fellow in the American Academy of Nursing, and serves on the Academy’s Acute and Critical Care Expert Panel. She is Co-Editor-in-Chief of the *American Journal of Critical Care*. She is active in the Southern Nursing Research Society, and is currently the President- elect.

Dr Mary Fran Tracy is a Critical Care Clinical Nurse Specialist at the University of Minnesota Medical Center, Fairview; Adjunct Clinical Professor at the University of Minnesota School of Nursing; and Adjunct Assistant Professor at the University of Minnesota School of Medicine. She



is a Past President of the American Association of Critical-Care Nurses and a Fellow in the American Academy of Nursing. Dr Tracy has published numerous papers and book chapters in the areas of critical care nursing, advanced practice nursing, and complementary therapies. Dr. Tracy is the Editor-in-Chief for American Association of Critical Care Nurses (AACN) Advanced Critical Care.

Session Description: The editors of the official journals of The American Association of Critical Care Nurses (AACN) will discuss their involvement in the annual AACN National Teaching Institute & Critical Care Exposition. The editors have created multiple opportunities to interact with authors, reviewers, and readers of the organization’s journals, including presentations in regular meeting sessions, targeted educational offerings in the Exposition Hall, and interactive events. We will discuss how our experiences could be adapted by editors in other organizations.

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(b) Title: Building Submissions through a Fellowship/Scholars Program

Presenter(s): Kathy Baker *PhD, RN, ACNS-BC, FAAN*, Susan Mace Weeks, *DNP, RN, CNS, LMFT, FAAN* and Diane A. Hawley, *PhD, RN, CNS, CCNS, CNE*

Speaker Bio(s): Dr Baker is the Director of the Doctor of Nursing Practice and Master of Science in Nursing programs at Texas Christian University in Fort Worth Texas, and the Editor of Gastroenterology Nursing. She is a board certified Adult Clinical Nurse Specialist and a popular speaker both in the United States and internationally. Dr. Baker is co-director of the Society of Gastroenterology Nurses and Associates Evidence-based Practice Fellowship and their Scholar Program. She is also a Deputy Director for the Texas Christian University Center for Evidence Practice and Research: A Collaborating Center of the Joanna Briggs Institute.

Dr Susan Weeks is Associate Dean of Nursing and Health Sciences at Texas Christian University, and also serves as the Director of the TCU Center for Evidence Based Practice & Research: A Collaborating Center of the Joanna Briggs Institute. She leads the Dallas Fort Worth Evidence Based Practice & Research Collaborative, and is the Director of the DFW Evidence Based Practice Fellowship. She is a Fellow of the American Academy of Nursing, and serves as an Appraiser with the American Nurses Credentialing Center’s Magnet Recognition Program. Over 35 years of healthcare experience fuel her passion for facilitating nursing practice that delivers quality care based on evidence.

Dr Hawley is Associate Professor of Professional Practice at Texas Christian University and



coordinator of the Texas Christian University Evidence Based Practice Fellowship. She is a Clinical Nurse Specialist in Critical Care and a research consultant for HCA North Texas Division. Her PhD focus was in curriculum and instruction.

Session Description: This session will highlight an innovative association-driven strategy to increase specialty-specific evidence-based practice implementation projects along with scholarly systematic reviews. In addition to the professional development experienced by participating members within the organization, the association journal is benefiting from the increase in manuscript submissions associated with the Evidence Based Practice Fellowship and Scholars programs.

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(c) Title: Reporting Guidelines for Music-Based Interventions-Improving Manuscript Quality Through Transparency

Presenter(s): Sheri L. Robb, PhD, MT-BC

Speaker Bio(s): Sheri L. Robb is an Associate Professor at the Indiana University School of Nursing, Indianapolis, Indiana and Editor for the Journal of Music Therapy. Sheri is a board-certified music therapist with degrees in music therapy and early childhood special education. She completed a post-doctoral fellowship in behavioral oncology and cancer control and a career development award through the Indiana Clinical and Translational Sciences Institute. Her program of research focuses on the development and testing of music-based interventions to manage distress, improves positive health outcomes, and prevent secondary psychosocial morbidity in children/adolescents with cancer and their parents.

Session Description: Session content will focus on how editors can use recently published Reporting Guidelines for Music-based Interventions to improve initial manuscript submissions, guide peer review, and improve the quality and consistency of music-based intervention reporting across nursing journals. Publication of music-based intervention studies is increasing, with more than 1,030 articles published in nursing journals over the last twenty years. Concomitant with this growth, are concerns about inadequate intervention descriptions in published research which limits cross-study comparisons and integration of findings into practice. We discuss guideline use to address problems with transparent/accurate reporting, and how these documents support CONSORT and TREND statements.

GENERAL SESSION 8

Title: Hot Topics as a Town Hall Meeting, INANE Potential Position Papers, Everything you wanted to know from your publisher and/or editor, and did not know to ask

Presenter(s): Roger Watson, *PhD, RN, FRCN, FAAN* and Jan Odom-Forren *PhD, RN, CPAN, FAAN*

Speaker Bio: Roger Watson is a graduate of The University of Edinburgh with a PhD in biochemistry from The University of Sheffield who qualified in nursing at St George’s Hospital, London. Working in care of older people, he has a special interest in the feeding and nutritional problems of older people with dementia. He is Editor-in-Chief of Journal of Advanced Nursing and a frequent visitor to China and Australia where he has visiting positions. He is Professor of Nursing, University of Hull and is a member of the UK Research Excellence Framework sub-panel in Allied Health Professions, Dentistry, Nursing and Pharmacy.

Dr Odom-Forren is an assistant professor at the University of Kentucky, College of Nursing and a perianesthesia nursing consultant. Clinically, she has been a staff nurse in PACU; clinical nurse specialist, perioperative services; nurse manager, PACU; and Director, Surgical Services She is an international lecturer on perianesthesia and moderate sedation issues and has published extensively in journals and books. Her research area of interest is postoperative symptom management, and her current research focused on post discharge nausea and vomiting. Jan is past president of the American Society of PeriAnesthesia Nurses and has served that organization in many capacities. She most recently has been a member of strategic work teams who developed ASPAN sponsored evidence-based guidelines on the management of PONV/PDNV and Perioperative Normothermia. She is a Fellow in the American Academy of Nursing and is currently a Co-Editor of the Journal of PeriAnesthesia Nursing. Her book, Practical Guide to Moderate Sedation/Analgesia, co-authored with Donna Watson was published in spring of 2005. Her 2nd book, Drain’s Perianesthesia Nursing: A Critical Care Approach (6th ed.) was published in 2012. She received her bachelor’s degree from Mississippi College and a master’s degree in nursing from the University of Southern Mississippi. She received a PhD in nursing from the University of Kentucky focusing on post discharge nausea and vomiting in ambulatory surgical patients in 2009.

Session Description: Open discussion of key topics in publishing and editing nursing journals. Bring your questions for publishers and editors, and participate in a lively dialogue.

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GENERAL SESSION 9

Title: The Ethical Minefield of Modern Academic Publishing

Presenter(s): Alan L. Kelly BSc (DCU), PhD

Speaker Bio: Alan Kelly is a Professor in the School of Food and Nutritional Sciences at University College Cork, where he was Dean of Graduate Studies from 2006-2013; he is Director Designate of the soon-to-be-established Institute of Food Research and Innovation at UCC. A dairy scientist, he has published around 200 original papers, book chapters and review articles, and has been an editor of International Dairy Journal since 2005. He regularly gives workshops and courses on all aspects of scientific publishing, including in particular the ethics of publishing.

Session Description: In recent years, the expectations on researchers to maintain the highest possible standards of academic integrity have risen steadily, and norms of conduct (particularly around Fabrication, Falsification and Plagiarism) have been established and defined. Breaches of these standards are severely regarded, and can prove highly detrimental to any researcher's career. Nonetheless, journal editors regularly encounter problems such as self-plagiarism, and publishers are debating best practice where cases of fraud are discovered in papers they are considering or have published. This paper will give an overview of the principal concerns when publishing scientific papers, examine a number of recent examples of unacceptable behaviour, and discuss the role of the editor in 'policing' such matters.

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GENERAL SESSION 10

Title: Reflections on more than a decade of editing International Nursing Review (International Council of Nurse’s journal)

Presenter(s): Jane Robinson, *PhD, FRCN, MA, RN, RHV, HVT, ONC, MCIPD*

Speaker Bio: Jane Robinson qualified as a nurse in 1957 and as a health visitor in 1970. During the 1980s she was Director of the Nursing Policy Studies Centre (Warwick University) and then Foundation Professor of Nursing at Nottingham. A Fulbright Senior Research Scholarship in 1997 was spent at The World Bank, Washington, and George Mason University, Virginia. Jane currently holds the position of Emeritus Professor at the University of Nottingham. She edited J. Advanced Nursing from 1997 –2002, and has since edited International Nursing Review for ICN. She retires in September.

Session Description: Five years editing JAN for Blackwell/Wiley were followed by almost eleven with INR for ICN. Reflections will focus briefly on editing for a publisher compared with a society-owned journal. Thoughts on INR will consider specifically the challenge of developing a journal focus for an organisation with more than 130 National Nursing Associations in membership, involving numerous projects and objectives, and for which manuscript submissions vary enormously in terms of content, levels of sophistication and competence.

Speaker Bio(s): Agnes Tiwari is a nurse with extensive experience in clinical practice, administration, education and research. She is professor and head of the School of Nursing at the Li Ka Shing Faculty of Medicine of the University of Hong Kong. Prevention of family violence is the focus of her practice, research, teaching and advocacy work. In recognition of her contributions to research and education on violence prevention, she was selected as a Fellow of the American Academy of Nursing in 2010, awarded the Women of Influence 2011 by the American Chamber of Commerce in Hong Kong, and received the HKU Research Output Prize in 2011.

Malka (Mally) Ehrenfeld is Associate Professor and Head of the School of Health Professions, Sackler Faculty of Medicine, in Tel Aviv University since 2010. Prior to being appointed as Head of School Mally held the positions of Associate Professor in Medicine, and Head of Department of Nursing. Mally currently serves as national representative for Israel on the Workgroup of European Nurse Researchers (WENR) Council, and the International Council of Nursing (ICN). Furthermore, she is a member of the Board of Governors at Gertner Institute, a founding member of the Israel Society for Nursing Research, and a member of the National Committee for Development of Professionalization in Nursing in the Ministry of Health, Israel. She also currently serves as a consultant for the Israel Society for Nursing Research. She is Editor of the Israel Journal for Nursing Research.

Merav Ben Natan is Director of the Pat Matthews Academic School of Nursing, at the Hillel Yaffe Medical Center in Hadera, Israel, and an instructor at the Department of Nursing, Tel Aviv University. She is Chairperson of the the Israel Society for Nursing Research and Editorial Board of the Hebrew Academic Journal "Body of Knowledge". Dr. Ben Natan's research interests is the image of nursing as a profession, family violence and women's health.

Joel Mancia has been Editor-in-Chief, Revista Enfermagem em Foco do COFEN (Journal Nursing in Focus: Magazine of the Federal Council of Nurses, Brazil) from 1998 to present. Joel is also Professor; Vice-Coordinator of Forum the Nursing journals of Nursing – ABEn Institution, Centro Universitário Metodista, 2007 to 2011.

Charlene Downing (currently Managing-Editor) has been working at Health SA Gesondheid (HSAG) since 2004 with the current Editor-in Chief, Prof Marie Poggenpoel being a founding member of the journal since 1994. HSAG is an interdisciplinary research journal at the University of Johannesburg, Johannesburg, South Africa that aims to promote communication, collaboration and teamwork between professions and disciplines within the health sciences to address problems that cross and affect disciplinary boundaries. The journal is the only English and Afrikaans journal that publishes original articles on issues related to public health, including implications for practical applications and service delivery that are of concern and relevance to Africa and other developing countries. The journal has a strong regional focus (South Africa) with abstracts published in English and Afrikaans.

Andrea Marshall is currently Professor of Acute and Complex Care Nursing at the Gold Coast Hospital and Griffith University, and a 2012 NHMRC TRIP (Translating Research into Practice) Fellow. Andrea's programme of research focuses on improving nutritional outcomes for acute and critically ill patients. She is currently the lead investigator on a study aimed at developing the capability of families of critically ill patients to advocate for best nutrition practice and this study is the key focus of her 2012 NHRMC TRIP Fellowship. Other nutrition research is being conducted in the areas of determining nutritional requirements using indirect calorimetry, the best methods for recording

protein calorie intake in hospitalised patients receiving oral nutrition and screening for malnutrition in acute care settings. Critical care research is also underway focusing on outcomes for critically ill elderly patients, sedation practice and practice development in ICU. Andrea is a co-investigator on a recently successful NHMRC grant for a randomised controlled trial examining how to securing intravenous devices effectively in hospitals (The SAVE Trial). Professionally, Andrea remains active with the Australian College of Critical Care Nurses and is Associate Editor for Australian Critical Care and Deputy Chair of the ACCCN Research Advisory Panel. Andrea has published over 40 manuscripts in peer-reviewed journals and contributed to critical care nursing textbooks in Australia and overseas.

Denise Wilson is the Editor-in-Chief of Nursing Praxis in New Zealand. Denise is a registered nurse with a background in clinical practice, undergraduate and postgraduate nursing education. She is currently Associate Professor in Maori Health and the Director of the Centre for Māori Health Research, based in the School of Public Health and Psychosocial Studies. Her areas of research are in Māori health, family violence, cultural issues, health service access, and health workforce development. She is a Fellow of the College of Nurses (Aotearoa) New Zealand, and of Te Mata o te Tau (Academy of Māori Research & Scholarship), and she is a member of the Health Research Council's College of Experts, the Health Quality & Safety Commission's Family Violence Death Review Committee and the Maori Committee, the Maori Nursing and Midwifery Clinical Leadership Steering Group, and of the Nursing Network for Violence Against Women International (NNVAWI). Denise has been the Editor-in-Chief for Nursing Praxis in New Zealand since 2009.

Josephine Hegarty is a Professor of Nursing in the Catherine McAuley School of Nursing and Midwifery, UCC. She trained as a general nurse in Cork University Hospital and attained her MSc in nurse education and PhD in physiology in University College Cork. Thereafter she worked as a lecturer and researcher within the Catherine McAuley School of Nursing and Midwifery, Brookfield Health Sciences Complex, University College Cork. She leads the cancer research strand within the school. Her research interests pertain to the experience of cancer and the mechanisms by which this experience can be optimised. Josephine has been a Cochrane Research Fellow. She supervises many PhD and MSc students for their research dissertations. Josephine has published extensively in the international literature. She is Editor of the Irish Journal of the Anaesthetic and Recovery Nurses Association.
